<p style="text-align: center;">READING</p> <p>Choose a book or chapter/s of a book to read. Imagine you had the chance to meet and interview one or some of the characters. Write down questions that you would ask them. Try to think of at least 6.</p> <p>You may wish to think about:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • How they are feeling at a certain point. • Would they have done something differently? • Is there something that you really want to know? <p>*Challenge – what do you think the answers of the character/s would be? You may wish to try:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Letter Scramble – if you have the game Scrabble at home, you could use the letter tiles to see how quickly you can make your words. You can always use magnetic letters, stones or pieces of paper with letters written on them. 	<p style="text-align: center;">WRITING:</p> <p><u>Buy Fairtrade</u></p> <p>Create a poster, advert or write a speech to persuade people to buy Fairtrade products.</p> <p>Things to think about:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • How will you convince people that Fairtrade is a better/fairer choice? • How will you 'hook' their attention? • What key points will you make? • What facts will you use to support your arguments? • Persuasive techniques E.g. repeating points, using emotional language, alliteration, powerful words and phrases. <p>*Challenge – you may wish to record your speech as a video or audio clip.</p> <div data-bbox="1720 1094 1868 1238" data-label="Image"> </div>

Division

1. Roll a dice to get digits to make a 2 or 3 digit number.
2. Roll the dice again to get a number to divide the number you made in step 1 by.

E.g. I rolled 3 then 5 so I put them together to make 35. I then rolled a 6 so my sum becomes $35 \div 6 = \underline{\quad}$.

Repeat the steps above to get lots of sums to practise.

Challenge – you can choose more digits to make trickier sums.

*If you have a pack of playing cards at home you could pick out numbered cards to give you digits for the sums.

Explore making cargo ship designs to see which one can hold and carry the most weight.

You will need:

- Tin/wrapping foil
- Scissors
- Cellotape (possibly)
- Coins (stones or other weighted items)
- Scales

(If you don't have scales a 1 pence piece weighs 3.5g approximately. You can use pennies and multiply the weight. You can get weights of other coins online too.)

How much weight can your boat hold before it sinks?

Can a larger ship hold more weight than a smaller one?

Does the shape matter?

Does it matter if the sides are higher?
